Our programs continued to focus on creating a supportive and enriching environment for all the boys. Through committed efforts in academic support, personal hygiene, extracurricular activities, and community celebrations, we have strived to foster confidence, creativity, and well-being. This annual report highlights the milestones achieved, the challenges faced, and the ongoing journey of transforming lives with compassion and dedication.

OUR KEY AREAS OF WORK

- **Residential Care:**

We provide a safe and loving home for children who are orphaned, abandoned, or from high-risk situations. Our home ensures their basic needs — food, clothing, shelter, and emotional support — are met.

- **Education Support:**

We facilitate school admissions, monitor academic progress, and provide tutoring support. This year, we successfully enrolled 12 new boys into a Government School, giving them access to formal education.

- **Health & Well-being:**

Regular health check-ups, mental health support, and recreational activities are organized to promote physical and emotional well-being.

- **Family & Community Reintegration:**

Wherever possible, we work toward reuniting children with safe and stable families or help them transition to independent living with life skills training and continued support.

- **Advocacy & Awareness:**

We engage with local communities and stakeholders to raise awareness about child rights, protection, and the importance of education

RESIDENTIAL CARE AT MATHRUBELAKU BOYS HOME :

In the year 2024-25, Mathrubelaku Boys Home provided residential care for 12 boys from vulnerable and high-risk backgrounds, including children of single parents, families affected by alcoholism, and those who were previously homeless or neglected. We ensured each child received safe shelter, nutritious meals, and round-the-clock care and protection in a nurturing environment. Our focus remained on restoring a sense of stability and security in their lives, while fostering emotional well-being and personal growth. Through this consistent and compassionate support, Mathrubelaku continues to be a place where children can heal, learn, and build a foundation for a brighter future

EDUCATION :

Daily Remedial Classes for Mathrubelaku Boys: To support the academic growth of our students, daily remedial classes in Kannada, English, and Mathematics were conducted throughout the year for the boys at Mathrubelaku. These sessions were effectively handled by our committed team members, Mr. Basavaraj and Mr. Nirupadi, who provided focused instruction tailored to individual learning needs. By revisiting core concepts and offering one-on-one support, the classes helped in closing learning gaps and improving overall academic performance. The initiative has had a meaningful impact, with students showing greater confidence and progress in their language and numeracy skills



Spoken English Classes for Children: As part of our commitment to holistic development, daily one-hour Spoken English classes were conducted for the children by Mr. Nirupadi and Mr. Basavaraj. These sessions focused on practical communication skills, vocabulary development, and pronunciation. Through interactive activities like conversations, role plays, and storytelling, students received regular opportunities to practice speaking in English. As a result of this consistent effort, many children can now communicate confidently in English and introduce themselves with ease. This improvement in spoken English has greatly enhanced their self-expression and confidence.

Weekend Computer Classes: To equip children with essential digital skills, weekend computer classes were conducted by Mr. Basavaraj throughout the year. The sessions covered fundamental topics such as the basic parts of a computer, typing practice, digital painting, and an introduction to MS Office tools. Through hands-on activities and regular practice, children developed a strong familiarity with computers. Many of them can now confidently identify basic computer components, type using a keyboard, create digital drawings in Paint, and use simple functions in MS Word and Excel. These sessions have laid a solid foundation in digital literacy, preparing them for future learning



Inter-NGO Drawing Competition:

Indian Roots Foundation, in collaboration with the Oracle team, organized an Inter-NGO Drawing Competition to encourage creativity and artistic expression among children from various homes. We are proud to share that our child, Sangamesh, won 1st prize in this competition, showcasing his talent and imagination through art. This event provided a great platform for our children to express themselves and interact with peers from other NGOs in a positive, creative environment.





Quiz & Pick and Speak Competitions: To improve general knowledge, communication skills, and awareness of current events, we conducted monthly quiz competitions and pick and speak sessions for our children. For the quiz, children were divided into three groups and competed enthusiastically each month, answering questions on current affairs, science, history, and more. In the pick and speak sessions, each child selected a topic and spoke for a few minutes, helping them build confidence, language skills, and public speaking ability. These regular activities encouraged learning, boosted self-esteem, and nurtured curiosity and creativity in a fun, interactive environment

Extracurricular Activities:

Throughout the year, the Mathrubelaku team organized a wide range of extracurricular activities to foster the holistic development of the children. These included creative pursuits such as art and craft, drawing, and colouring, which helped nurture the children's imagination and fine motor skills.

To promote physical fitness and teamwork, various indoor and outdoor games were conducted, including chess, carom, puzzles, football, cricket, and cycling. The children also participated enthusiastically in song and dance practice, which boosted their confidence and stage presence.

These activities provided the children with opportunities to learn new skills, build friendships, and enjoy their time in a balanced and joyful environment

HEALTH AND HYGIENE :

As part of our commitment to children's overall well-being, regular emphasis was placed on health and hygiene practices throughout the year. Daily routines and awareness sessions helped children develop good habits and stay healthy. BMI Check up

BMI Check-up: As part of our ongoing focus on children's health and nutrition, we conducted quarterly BMI (Body Mass Index) checks to monitor the growth and physical well-being of every child. Based on the assessments, we identified children who were underweight and took special steps to support their nutritional needs. We provided them with additional supplements such as eggs, malt, sprouts, and fruits to help improve their overall health and development. This initiative has been an important step in ensuring that all our children receive the care and nutrition they need to grow strong and healthy



Weekly Nail Cutting and Ear Cleaning:

Regular nail cutting and ear cleaning sessions were conducted every week to ensure the children maintained good personal hygiene and prevent infections



Yoga and Exercise: To promote physical well-being and mental focus, we conduct daily morning yoga and exercise sessions for our children. These sessions help improve their flexibility, concentration, and overall health while instilling discipline and a positive start to their day. Regular practice of yoga has also helped reduce stress and improve emotional balance among the children



Daily Hand Wash: To promote good health and prevent the spread of germs, children were encouraged to wash their hands thoroughly with soap every day. This daily practice was integrated into their routine before meals and after using the restroom. Teachers regularly supervised and reminded the children to ensure proper hand hygiene. As a result, children developed strong habits that contribute to their overall well-being

Sessions on Personal Hygiene: Twice a month, we organized sessions to educate children about personal hygiene and its importance. The sessions included guidance on maintaining cleanliness, grooming, and healthy daily habits. Children were encouraged to practice these habits regularly to stay healthy and prevent illness. These interactive sessions helped build awareness and responsibility towards self-care



Bed Sheets and Blankets Cleaning: To maintain a clean and healthy living environment, bed sheets and blankets were washed and cleaned every month. This regular cleaning helped prevent the spread of germs and ensured the children slept in hygienic conditions. The practice promoted good health and comfort among the children. Monthly cleaning routines were closely monitored by the staff to maintain high standards of cleanliness



CELEBRATIONS:

In the year 2024-25, all children's birthdays, special days, and festivals were joyfully celebrated at Mathrubelaku Boys Home. These occasions were marked with enthusiasm and togetherness, fostering a sense of community and happiness among the boys. Celebrations included decorations, cultural programs, and shared meals, creating memorable moments and strengthening bonds within the home. Children Birthday

Birthday Celebrations: At Mathrubelaku Boys Home, the birthdays of all children were celebrated at the end of every month with joy and enthusiasm. The Meraki team generously sponsored a cake each month, making the celebrations even more special for the children. These monthly gatherings helped create a warm, inclusive environment where every child felt valued and cherished



Children's Day Celebration :

As part of our regular Saturday children's meetings, a special Children's Day celebration was organized at Mathrubelaku Boys Home. The event was planned with fun-filled activities and learning moments to make the day memorable for all the children.

The team arranged a variety of games such as musical chairs, running races, and other engaging group activities that brought joy and excitement to the children. Along with the fun, the team also shared the life story of Pandit Jawaharlal Neharu, highlighting his love for children and explaining the significance of celebrating Children's Day. This helped the children understand the values of care, respect, and the importance of their role in society.

The celebration ended on a sweet note with a cake-cutting ceremony, where all the children participated happily. The day was filled with smiles, learning, and joyful memories that the children truly cherished.



Republic Day and Independence Day Celebrations:

Republic Day and Independence Day were celebrated with great enthusiasm both at government schools and at Mathrubelaku Boys Home. Our children actively participated in various cultural programs organized at their schools, showcasing their talents through dance performances, singing competitions, speeches, and other activities.

For the first time, we also held a three-day Ganesh Pratisthapana celebration at the children's home, which included daily pooja, devotional songs, and cultural programs—creating a spiritual and festive atmosphere for everyone.

We also welcomed the New Year 2025 with great excitement by cutting a cake at midnight (12:00 AM), marking a joyful and hopeful beginning for the year ahead.

OUTING :

ISKCON Temple & Rajkumar Memorial: As part of our annual recreational activities, we organized a one-day outing for our children to visit the ISKCON Temple and the memorials of Rajkumar, Puneeth Rajkumar, and Ambarish. The children were delighted to explore these culturally significant places and paid their respects to the legendary figures of Karnataka. At the ISKCON Temple, they enjoyed a delicious prasadam meal, which added a spiritual and joyful touch to the visit. The outing was filled with learning, happiness, and memorable experiences, leaving the children with smiles and stories to share. It was a truly enriching and enjoyable day for everyone



GKVK Krushi Mela: As part of our educational exposure activities, the children were taken on a visit to the GKVK Krishi Mela. The mela provided a wonderful opportunity for them to learn about agriculture, farming techniques, organic produce, and modern innovations in the agricultural sector. The children were fascinated by the wide variety of crops, farming equipment, and live demonstrations. They also interacted with farmers and experts, gaining valuable insights into sustainable farming practices. The visit sparked curiosity and interest in nature and farming among the children, making it an informative and enjoyable experience

SUMMER CAMP :

This year, we successfully conducted a one-month Summer Camp filled with a variety of educational and extracurricular activities for the children. The camp provided a joyful and enriching environment where children could learn, explore, and express themselves. We were delighted to have Vittal Sir and the Agama Foundation team actively involved in the camp. They conducted engaging sessions in spoken English—where children learned to make simple sentences—and in Mathematics, where they practiced multiplication tables, solved problems, and learned about different shapes. They also led sessions in dance, songs, and public speaking, helping the children build confidence and communication skills. Our own team organized creative and fun-filled workshops such as paper cutting, kite making, and making dream catchers using tea cups. Children also took part in art and craft activities, including coloring and designing. The children thoroughly enjoyed the one-month camp, participating with great enthusiasm and returning each day with smiles and excitement. It was truly a memorable summer filled with learning and joy



BUNKERS AND BEDS FOR CHILDREN

To ensure a safe and comfortable living environment for the children at Mathrubelaku Boys Home, bunk beds were arranged with the generous support of our well-wishers. The Bodhi Tree team supported us in providing strong and safe bunker frames, while Ms. Ramya Suresh Reddy extended her support by arranging mattresses and bedding for the children.

This thoughtful contribution has helped create an organized and restful sleeping space, improving the quality of life for the children and promoting better health and hygiene. We deeply appreciate the kindness and commitment of our supporters in helping us build a nurturing home for our children.



TEAM MEETING:

The Mathrubelaku team conducted regular monthly meetings to plan, review, and coordinate key activities related to the care and development of the children. These meetings were usually held at the Mathrubelaku Boys Home, and when physical meetings were not possible, the team connected virtually through Zoom.

During these meetings, important topics were discussed, including the admission of needy children, their education, health, and overall well-being. The team also focused on the mobilization of resources—both cash and kind—as well as building partnerships with companies, donors, and volunteers.

In addition, the team actively engaged in planning and executing new programs aimed at enhancing the educational and personal development of the children. These included extracurricular activities, special events, awareness sessions, and skill-building workshops. Regular team meetings played a vital role in ensuring that all initiatives were well-coordinated, goal-driven, and impactful.



CHILDREN'S MEETINGS :

At Mathrubelaku Boys Home, weekly children's meetings are conducted every Saturday. These gatherings provide a safe and open platform for children to express themselves, build confidence, and actively participate in the functioning of the home. During each meeting, all children come together and begin by warmly welcoming teachers, staff, and fellow children. They are encouraged to share their concerns, challenges, and needs openly. The team listens attentively and works together to provide practical solutions and timely support. Whether it is related to personal issues, academic help, or daily needs, the children's voices are heard and respected. These meetings not only promote open communication and problem-solving, but also help children develop a sense of responsibility, belonging, and trust within the Mathrubelaku family.

Family Background: Beraaj is a cheerful and enthusiastic 6-year-old boy studying in 1st standard. He lives in Atturu Layout, Bangalore, with his father, Mr. Siddaram Joshi. Beraaj comes from a single-parent family. His mother left the family when he was very young, and since then, his father has taken full responsibility for his upbringing.

Reason for Admission: Mr. Siddaram Joshi works at a small mobile shop and resides there due to the absence of proper housing. He faced significant challenges in providing consistent education, care, and protection for Beraaj. Understanding the importance of a safe and nurturing environment for his son's growth, he decided to admit Beraaj to Mathrubelaku Boys Home in hopes of securing a better future for him.

Before Admitting to Mathrubelaku: Before joining Mathrubelaku Boys Home, Beraaj was very naughty, found it difficult to mingle with other children, and showed little interest in studying. Due to a lack of proper guidance, a structured routine, and a supportive social environment, he struggled with discipline, focus, and social interaction.

Progress at Mathrubelaku: Since joining Mathrubelaku, Beraaj has shown remarkable improvement in his behaviour, academics, and ability to interact with others. He has become more disciplined, actively takes part in daily routines, and has built strong friendships with other children.

Beraaj expresses great happiness and comfort in staying at Mathrubelaku Boys Home. His positive transformation is a reflection of the care, structure, and encouragement provided by the foundation. He continues to grow each day with confidence, joy, and a bright future ahead.

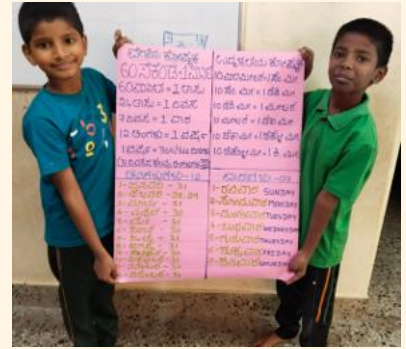

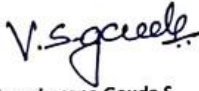

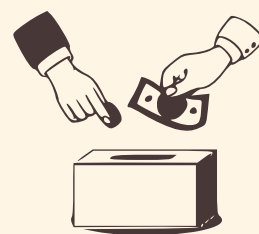
